

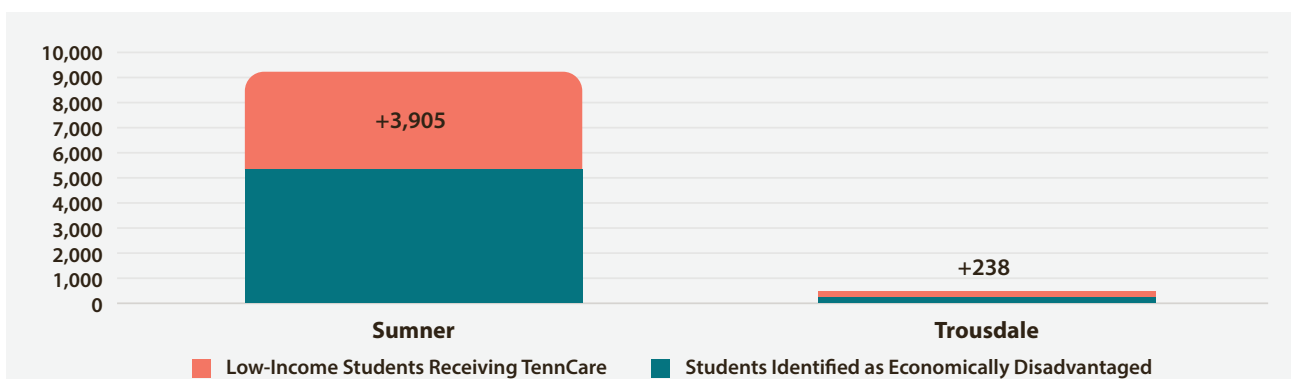
# Who We Measure Determines Who Gets Support

## Tennessee Uses Direct Certification to Identify Economically Disadvantaged Students

Direct certification uses participation in Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP) and Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) to identify low-income students for funding through TISA. This method is undercounting students experiencing poverty.

## Incorporating TennCare Data Would Improve Accuracy and Ensure Adequate Funding

Tennessee already uses TennCare data to identify students eligible for Free and Reduced-Price Lunch. Including TennCare alongside SNAP and TANF for school funding would better meet the needs of students using data that is already being collected in schools and districts.
